| 1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process | | |
| Curriculum is the essential ingredient of any education system | | |

ne education level. All other aspects whether teaching, learning and evaluation or research and development, infrastructure and learning resources, student activities and support system revolve around it. Therefore, curricular aspects and the best practices connected to curriculum design and development play a very significant dimension of the quality of higher education since the curriculum has a decisive role in steering the other elements of quality. Reviewing and updating of the curriculum is the essential ingredient of any vibrant academic system. There ought to be a dynamic curriculum with necessary additions and changes introduced in it from time to time by the respective university with a prime objective to maintain updated curriculum and also providing their inputs to take care of fast paced development in the knowledge of the subject concerned. Designing of the curriculum to suit the clientele is important. Revising the curriculum should be a continuous process to provide

an updated education to the students at large.

At the commencement of the Academic year the Academic calendar is prepared by the Committee organized for the said purpose. The teachers prepare the teaching plan of their respective subjects and is verified by the Head of the Department. There is sufficient flexibility in the teaching plan, so as to adopt the changes if any. The evaluation of the students is carried out periodically as per the norms of the University of Kerala. We undertake following measures for effective delivery of the university curriculum at college level

Each faculty member prepares a detailed course plan including the text book(s), reference book(s), web resource(s) and ICT tool(s) to be used for each topic. It also includes the topics to be covered beyond the curriculum which is then disseminated to the concerned students after approval of the Head of the Department.For the proper delivery of content among students, new and innovative teaching techniques, in addition to the traditional lecture method are adopted by the faculty.Learner-centric techniques such as peer learning, collaborative learning, group discussion, video lectures, quiz etc., are employed to encourage students' active participation.

• There is a faculty wise timetable committee which prepares the timetable as per workload for the academic session.

• The Principal addresses the newly admitted students in "Induction Program". This program orients the students about: facilities and welfare schemes available, code of conduct and discipline, add-on courses and extra-curricular activities.

• The faculty members take few lectures on the introduction of the curriculum.

• Unit Tests are conducted periodically and its results is displayed and discussed with the students in the class room.

• Periodical meetings of Head of the Departments are held by IQAC with the Principal to take review and discuss the curriculum delivery.

• The faculty engages extra periods and praticals as and when necessary and maintains their records.

• The college encourages the faculty to participate in

Orientation and Refresher courses to update their knowledge of subject.

- The college encourages the faculty to attend the meetings of BOS and syllabus restructuring workshops.
- The college takes initiative and encourages staff to attend workshops organised by the University for effectively implementing the CBCS method of imparting curriculum.

• Intra-departmental meetings for the review of the teaching, planning of unit tests, seminars etc. are also conducted.

• Assignments, seminars, workshops and projects are given to the students under the supervision of the faculty.

• Guest lectures of eminent faculty members from other institutions are arranged to give exposure of the current trends and the latest subject knowledge.

• ICT is used for effective teaching by the teachers of various departments.

- The departments organize study tours, excursions, field project and industrial visits for students' exposure to practical knowledge.
- The faculty members encourage the students to read the reference books and take use of e- resources available at the institute to update and enhance their subject knowledge.
- UGC sponsored Career-Oriented Courses are introduced in all faculties to enhance the employability of the students.
- Short Term Courses and Soft Skill programs are conducted for the overall development of the students.
- Remedial coaching is given to slow learners and merit mission concept is implemented for advance learners. Additional facilities such as extra book issue and personal counseling are provided to slow and advanced learners.
- Students-Teacher -Guardian Scheme (Mentor-Mentee) is implemented for identifying problems of the students regarding academic, social and financial issues.
- The college collects the feedback from the faculty, students, alumni and parents.
 The collected feed back is analysed using different parameters and the performance of the students, faculty and institution is assessed.
- Any discrepancies identified are considered for correction and suggestions are taken for improvement.
- Formative assessment is done to identify gaps in students' knowledge which helps to identify slow and advanced

learners.

- The slow learners are provided with Remedial Coaching after the completion of each semester.
- The advanced learners are encouraged for further progression in career by participating in various co-curricular activities and career oriented programmes organised by the college and outside the college
- The faculty makes suggestions in curriculum reframing workshops in the light of feedback received.
- The achievements of objectives of the syllabus are measured through students' performance in Internal tests, Group discussions, Presentations and University examinations.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

Before the commencement of each semester, University notifies an academic calendar for all the programs, which contains the date of commencement, last working day of the semester and dates for semester-end examinations. Our college follows the calendar issued by the University of Kerala strictly and plans all its activities including the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE). The College prepares academic calendar conforming to the one released by the University. This academic calendar is published on the website of the college and also shared with all the Departments. The Continuous Internal Evaluation by all the departments is completed as per this. The record of internal assessment is maintained at college level. The members of the faculty plan their course delivery, research work and other academic and extracurricular activities as per this. Department heads closely supervise and monitor the completion of the syllabus as per the lesson plan prepared by faculty members. Syllabus coverage for each CIE is decided well in advance and faculty members adhere to it. Internal Assessment tests (IA), assignments, quizzes, and seminars are part of the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) of students. There is a well-defined process for the conduct of CIE as per the calendar of events. The CLMC is in charge of preparation of the exam schedule for the conduct of internal assessment. Post IA tests, evaluation of answer scripts, and

calculations are carried out by respective Course Instructors. The Principal, through the CLMC frequently reviews the semester's progress and provides appropriate suggestions.

1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Response:

UG and PG students are admitted as per the admission norms of the

University of Kerala. Admission is purely based on the centralized allotment system of the University of Kerala. Based on this interaction between the Principal, the head of the department, the tutor of the first year UG/PG class with the students and their parents during the time of the admission process, a score of entrylevel test conducted by all departments, marks of qualifying examinations helps to identify advanced and slow learners. Students are assessed in multiple ways and levels during the course. University has provided an embedded evaluative system (formative and summative) as part of CBCSS. The continuous assessment helps to evaluate the learning pace of the student.

Special attention is given to slow learners by providing special training sessions like remedial coaching, tutorial sessions, c to bridge the gap between the slow and advanced learners Financially disadvantaged students are given financial aid to purchase study materials, books, and even mobiles phones. Bridge courses are conducted by all departments at the beginning of every academic year for the non-subject students enabling them to cope with the program to which they are enrolled as well as helping to bridge the knowledge gaps of students with lesser exposure to advanced studies. Tutorial meet, an initiative put forward by our Principal, are conducted weekly once on all Wednesdays which help the students to disclose their academic and personal matters to their mentor. Both department and institution-level programs like workshops, seminars, invited talks, exhibitions quizzes, debates, and other such activities are arranged by the institution, which helps the students to attain more knowledge. Peer teaching and Cross teaching mechanisms are also practiced by all the departments of the institution which helps in enhancing their confidence.

The advanced learners identified during the commencement of each course will be given due attention and care and they are motivated strongly to attain top marks in University Examinations. The Ethics Committee, NSS, Women Study's Unit functioning in the college, and the teachers provide academic and personal counseling to the needy students. Advanced learners are encouraged to participate in the webinars organized by various colleges and in the intercollegiate competitions and many of them bag prizes as well. PSC coaching. The college is effectively imparting PSC coaching to our students through a new project GURUKULAM thereby making our students capable to attend any competitive examinations. The college honors the excellence and academic achievements of the students by organizing Merit Day every year. Students, who secured top marks in the University Examination, are honored with medals and mementos on Merit Day.

Advanced learners at the PG level are given ample opportunities to augment their research acumen. They are also given NET /JRF coaching and mock tests. Awareness programmes on academic research are also organized for Post Graduate students in order to make them aware of the need for research, various funding agencies in India and abroad . Attending such webinars helps them to get an elaborate idea on how to draft a good synopsis.

Interactive sessions with resource persons from various walks of life are also conducted in the institution for inspiration. Students are also motivated to make the best use of library facilities. The college is sensitive to the special needs of the differently-abled students to enable them to have ease in their mobility by constructing ramps on all blocks. Scribes are also provided by the Institution for the deserving candidates for the University Examinations.

Additional Measures for Advanced Learners:

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Response:

The institution imparts a variety of methods for enhancing the learning process of students through the means of experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies for attaining the holistic development of the student. The institution emphasizes student-centric teaching and learning with modern teaching aids like special lectures, video lectures, demonstration classes, etc. Students are taken for field trips, industry visits, etc in order to understand the learning concepts. Besides the traditional chalk and board methods, ICTenabled techniques are also used in classrooms to make the teaching-learning process up to date. We have incorporated specific methods into the formal teaching framework, such as projects, debates, problem-solving, presentations, competitions, hands-on workshops, discussion, and peer learning.

The common student-centric methods followed by various departments are listed below:

Problem-solving methods:

Quiz, projects, assignments, organizing, and participating students in national/college-level seminars, MCQ tests Projects are mandatory in the curriculum. Group projects for UG students help them to learn as to how to behave in and work as a group. Individual projects are given to PG students. They either do their work or a part of their work in reputed institutions. The internship is offered by the PG Department of Commerce as part of their curriculum. These make the students more self-reliant

Experiential Methods

Field trips, demonstrations, internship, skits, documentary production, poster exhibitions, demonstrations, practicals, workshops, survey, simulation, role play, language lab, visit research and development centers such as VSSC, NIIST, NCESS, visit to destitute homes and palliative care centers, Community interaction programmes etc

• There is complete transparency in the internal assessment. The criterion adopted is as

directed by the university.

- At the beginning of the semester, faculty members inform the students about the various components in the assessment process during the semester.
- The internal assessment test schedules are prepared as per the university and communicated to the students well in advance.
- To ensure proper conduct of formative tests, invigilators are given proper instruction before assigning invigilation duty.
- Evaluation is done by the course handling faculty members within on week from the date of examination.
- The corrected answer scripts at random are verified by HOD to ensure the standard

evaluation process.

- The corrected answer papers of the students are distributed to them for the verification by the students and any grievance is redressed immediately.
- The marks obtained by the students in internal assessment tests are displayed on the department notice board.
- The students signature is collected in consolidated CE mark statement before uploading it on the University web portal.
- The marks obtained by the students in internal assessment tests are uploaded periodically on the university web portal in three levels, Tutor, Hod and Principal level.
- Noting the values in observation and validating the theoretical aspects student must submit lab record regularly.
- Day to day performance of the students is assessed for every experiment which includes

regularity, performance, viva and the promptness in submitting the record.

- For lab courses, the marks/grade scored by the student for each experiment is indicated in the observation/record. The independent learning, practical approach to the real-time applications is tested by viva voce for laboratory courses.
- The end examination for the laboratory and projects shall be conducted with internal and external examiner appointed from the other colleges as decided by the University.
- If a student is not able to appear for examination due to medical or any genuine reason examination is conducted for that student as per norms, provided that he/she submits application with proper documents.
- The grievances of the students with reference to assessment are made clear by showing his/her performance in the answer sheet.
- The answer sheet of such student is assessed by the faculty once again in the presence of the student. Any corrections in the total of marks or assessment of answer books as identified by students are immediately done by the faculty members.
- Any student who is not satisfied with the assessment and award of marks may approach the concern HOD who can intervene and seek opinion of their tutor.
- As external exams are conducted by the University the college has only the duty of arranging the facilities for

smooth and fair conduction of exams in the college by strict vigilance.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Sree Narayana College Chathannur is having four well equipped laboratories which include two Chemistry labs, one physics lab and one computer lab. The lab equipments are purchased by the purchasing committee based on the decisions taken by the college council on the requirement list given by the department heads. Funds from PD , management and departments are utilized for purchasing lab equipments.

College laboratories are maintaining Stock registers for chemicals, equipments, apparatus and furniture, and charge of monitoring these registers are assigned to teaching staffs and periodically these registers are regularly supervised by HoD of concerned departments. Annual stock verification is done by the concerned teaching faculties in charge, and finally these stocks are verified again by other department faculties.

Services of expert lab attendants are provided in all labs. Repairing, maintenance and annual calibrations of equipments are also done periodically by the external agencies. Lab rules are displayed in the laboratories for safe handling of chemicals and laboratory apparatus. Frequent maintenance of laboratories are done and is monitored by concerned department HODs.

Library:

Our college library is having a good collection of books, journals, periodicals. It is open to students and teachers from 9.am to 5 pm on all working days. Library committee help in smooth functioning of library activities. In addition to that we are utilizing the service of a library assistant for managing and distribution of library books to students, teaching and non teaching staffs. College library is using PD account for purchasing books and journals. Yearly auditing is conducted and shortages of books are being noted and the list of required books is forwarded by the concerned department HoDs to the principal, the request then forwarded to library committee for final approval. No dues certificate is mandated for students to appear for university examinations.

Departments are maintaining department libraries to support

students in academics. A teaching faculty of the concerned department has been given duty for managing the books and maintaining the stock register of department library

Class Rooms:

Our college is providing good class room facilities to students admitted in the college. Daily cleaning is done by the sweepers appointed by the college. Repairing of electrical appliances is done periodically by external agency assigned by college management and PTA. Along with drinking water facility , water coolers are also provided to students.

Hostel facility: Our College has started functioning a women's hostel in the college campus providing accommodation for about 35 students. We have six rooms and dormitory facility and currently we are allowing three students in each room. Wi-Fi facility has enabled in hostel premises and students can access this facility. College has appointed security staffs to ensure the safety of hostel premises.

Laboratories:

Sree Narayana College Chathannur is having four well equipped laboratories which include two Chemistry labs, one physics lab and one computer lab. The lab equipments are purchased by the purchasing committee based on the decisions taken by the college council on the requirement list given by the department heads. Funds from PD , management and departments are utilized for purchasing lab equipments.

College laboratories are maintaining Stock registers for chemicals, equipments, apparatus and furniture, and charge of monitoring these registers are assigned to teaching staffs and periodically these registers are regularly supervised by HoD of concerned departments. Annual stock verification is done by the concerned teaching faculties in charge, and finally these stocks are verified again by other department faculties.

Academic and Administrative Bodies/Committees

Students are given the foremost importance and representation in

the administrative, co-curricular and extracurricular activities in the college. College administration has taken all measures to facilitate admission and student support services. An elected body of students headed by the union Chairman is coordinating all student centered activities in the college. Union chairman is also a member of college council which is a body headed by Principal and comprising of all head of the departments and three elected members from teachers and administrative assistant. College council functions as an advisory body helping principal to manage all day to day activities of the college and by resolving all issues pertaining to the general interest of the institution. Chairman gets an opportunity to raise various issues faced by students and to put forward suggestions to improve the academic and extracurricular activities in the college in the council meetings. Curriculum Development:- Because the institution is associated with Kerala University, the affiliated University's curriculum and syllabi have been followed. 1. Faculty members serve on the Board of Studies of the university. 2. Faculty members participate in the Kerala University's course restructure and revision committees, allowing them to contribute to the development of the curriculum even inside the affiliation system. Some of the academics serve as question paper setters, chairman of examinations, chief evaluators, and extra evaluators of test scripts at various universities and autonomous colleges. 4. Faculty members are encouraged to take on projects, publish research papers, mentor research students, organise and participate in seminars/workshops, all of which have had a significant impact on the quality of the faculty and their contribution to curriculum development. • Industrial and subject experts are consulted, and feedback from various stakeholders has been another measure for quality enhancement.

1. Teaching and Learning: The following are the teaching and learning methodologies that have been implemented. 1. A wellthought-out course handout with objectives and learning outcomes for each subject. 2. In addition to traditional lecture approaches, a variety of pedagogical tools that incorporate the most up-to-date teaching and learning methodologies are used. Role play, survey, and film display are some of the approaches used. 3. Added Value Programs are held to help pupils improve their skills and prepare them for future challenges. 4. Remedial and backlog classes to meet the various needs of students 5. Student seminars, peerto-peer learning, discussions, and debates have all been implemented. 6. Students were given assignments and projects to instil a research aptitude in them. 7. Internal examinations, assignments, and student seminars/viva are used to examine the Institution's Teaching, Learning, and Assessment procedures on a regular basis. Students receive mentoring, tutoring, counselling, and other services. 9. Students with specific needs receive scholarships and other help. 10. Students are given resources to help them make better use of virtual learning platforms such as MOODLE and SWAYAM. SWAYAMNPTEL site has designated the college as an active local branch. 11. The IQAC keeps track of contentrelated seminars for students and ensures that eminent speakers are invited to share their knowledge with them. 12. In addition, teachers are encouraged to continue to engage their students with activities such as power point presentations, field trips, and applicable extension activities. 13. Through numerous activities and programmes, great care is made to create a healthy environment that supports academic success, inherent skills, new ideas, and creativity in pupils. 14. A variety of quizzes and competitions are held to foster and encourage academic brilliance in students. 15. Students are encouraged to compete in numerous tournaments held by other universities. 16. The IQAC and department heads collect feedback from diverse stakeholders on the teaching-learning process. This feedback is analysed in order to improve teaching and learning. 17. Results are analysed on a departmental basis in order to improve the teaching-learning process.

Examination and Evaluation: - Every department evaluates itself on

a weekly basis through tests, assignments, quizzes, and pre-final exams. A College Level Monitoring Committee (CLMC) guarantees that the Kerala university pattern is followed when creating and grading the question paper. Students receive constructive test comments, and exam results are posted on the department bulletin board. • CLMC also supervises and assesses the Examination Cell's actions on a regular basis to guarantee that students are continuously and comprehensively evaluated and that examinations are conducted on time. •At the PTA meeting, the students' academic progress is discussed with the parents. • A well-functioning Malpractice Prevention Cell Kerala University is in charge of the external examinations. CLMC keeps track of how each department registers for exams and uploads internal grades to the university web.

Research and Development: - : - Because research is such an important aspect of institutional development, there are a variety of ways to foster a research culture. Attending workshops is strongly encouraged, and attendees are granted duty leave. A student seminar series is also offered on a regular basis. The faculty member has published one book. The Research Committee and the IQAC are active in the university, promoting faculty and student research initiatives. Staff and students have access to information about upcoming projects, funding sources, application forms, and so on. Teachers are encouraged to apply for Major/Minor Research Projects, FDPs, and other opportunities within the college. 6.3.5 - Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non- teaching staff

The institution has an effective Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff. Every year the outgoing students carry out and submit Teacher Evaluation and Campus Evaluation surveys. The Teacher Evaluation forms have different criteria related to aspects of teaching on which the opinion of the students is sought. The duly filled in forms are analysed by the Principal and the Feedback thus obtained is judiciously addressed for the betterment of the Teaching-Learning process. In cases where laxity or lacunae is observed the teacher in question is counselled by the Principal and urged to improve his/her performance in the interest of professional upgradation and better service-delivery to our primary stakeholders, namely the students.

The performance of those teaching staff members who have not fared well in the students' feedback is closely monitored. An improvement in the subsequent performance of the said staff members has usually been noticed. In the infrequent instances when this does not happen systematic reminders are issued to the concerned staff member in a bid to correct imbalances and restore optimal efficiency in the institution.

"PBAS [performance based appraisal system]"

.All teaching faculty member fill the prescribed format of PBAS for self-appraisal.

Promotions are based on the PBAS proforma for UGC Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) that is based on the API score.

The institute undertakes a wide range of activities besides academics, for which faculty members are assigned additional duties and responsibilities, which are mostly voluntary.

The Institute accords appropriate weightage for these contributions in their overall assessment.

The faculty members are informed well in advance of their due promotion.

The PBAS proforma filled by the Faculty Member is checked and verified by the Heads of the Departments, followed by HOD and IQAC

Faculty members whose promotions are due are recommended based on their API score and are required to appear before the screeningcum-selection committee.

This system encourages them to make excellent performance in teaching and learning. The institution has PBAS for assessment of teaching staff. The appraisal report is based on the annual performance of the employee on the basis of their academic, research and other extracurricular activities. This format [PBAS] is filled by the employee in a given prescribed proforma, which includes all the above set related to points and sub-points.

The mechanisms used to monitor effective and efficient use of financial resources are as below:

- Before the commencement of every financial year, principal submits a proposal on budget allocation, by considering the recommendations made by the heads of all the departments, to the management.
- College budget includes recurring expenses such as salary, electricity, internet charges, maintenance cost, stationery, other consumable charges etc., and non - recurring expenses like lab equipment purchases, furniture and other development expenses.
- The expenses will be monitored by the accounts department as per the budget allocated by the management.
- The depreciation costs of various things purchased in the preceding years are also worked out.

The institution is subject to auditing by Directorate of Collegiate Education in all financial matters. Timely audit is done annually in the form of department audits and Accountant General's audit. Accounts of the Funds received other than management contributions are prepared in the College office and audited as per the norms of the UGC, the Government and the University. The external audit of the funds from the Government is done by a Government auditor appointed by the Department of Collegiate Education and Accountant General's Office. The funds received from the UGC are properly utilized and utilization certificate along with the audited accounts prepared by a Chartered Accountant are sent to the UGC. The audit of funds contributed by the Management is done internally and externally. PTA fund and other funds are audited externally. Rectifications regarding audit objections were done by the college administrative wing under the guidance of the principal.

The institution did not come across with any major audit objection during the preceding years. All these mechanisms exhibit the transparency being maintained in financial matters and adherence to financial discipline to avoid defalcation of funds or properties of the institution at all levels. 6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes

SNC, Chathannoor attempts to chisel out the total quality person through a persistent focus

on imparting quality education, through its innovative, comprehensive and flexible

education policy. Its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) carries out activities that

encompass all aspects of the Institute's functioning. The IQAC Cell of the college works towards improving and maintaining the quality of education, identifying and suggesting new ways of using teaching aids, developing suitable infrastructure, and offering suggestions for the courses. IQAC is an effective and efficient internal coordinating and monitoring mechanism. The IQAC plays a vital role in maintaining and enhancing the quality of the institution and suggests quality enhancement measures to be adopted. The IQAC conducts meeting plan, direct, implement and evaluate the teaching, research, and publication activities in the College.. The IQAC strives to spread quality culture through quality enhancement initiatives and best practices. Significant improvements in quality have been made by institutionalizing the following

Academic Audit through IQAC : The college takes academic audit of each department and various committees every year through IQAC to increase and maintain the quality of education. Academic Audit Committee is set up for this purpose. 7.1.3 - Describe the facilities in the Institution for the management of the following types of degradable and non-degradable waste (within 200 words) Solid waste management Liquid waste management Biomedical waste management E-waste management Waste recycling system Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management

The institution has implemented two bin system in all the buildings , one for collecting degradable waste and other for nondegradable waste. There is waste bin in each class for collecting paper waste from class. The food waste from hostel is used as a compost for gardening and agriculture. Waste water from college and hostel is used to water the plants and newly planted trees. Disposable plastic containers and jars are used to grow plants. Steel bottle is encouraged to avoid the use disposable bottles. S.N. College, Chathannur offers quality environment opportunities for intellectual and emotional growth through different programs which are relevant and responsive to the needs of rural and educationally backward society. S.N College, Chathannur provides principles of scientific waste management by three R's Reduce, Reuse and Recycle were formulated. Several green practices were conducted by the student and the staff using methods like practicing organic farming , conservation of water bodies, promoting waste literacy etc. Students engage in volunteer work to reduce plastic littering and other green habits among households. Thus a programme of outdoor campus is also undertaken by NSS authorities. Incandescent bulbs were replaced with low LED bulbs.

With regards to wastage disposal of laboratories are concerned, they follows green chemistry principles that aims to maximize efficiency and minimize hazardous effects on human health and environment. With regards to tiffin and lunch boxes are concerned, recycling bins and plastic-free environment is initiated by the Department of Chemistry inside the campus. The generated waste material is isolated into solid, liquid and e-waste. The waste materials like plastics, papers, glasswares, etc are collected on a daily basis and sold out to scrap vendors, good laboratory practices are followed by the Department of Chemistry which includes periodical monitoring and safety of the personnel. A strict protocol of liquid waste management is practiced inside the lab. The liquid waste segregated into organic and inorganic wastes. The organic liquid is distilled and the separate component are reused for another experiment. Inorganic wastes such as concentrated acidic or alkaline solutions are neutralized before disposal. Indiscriminate usage of chemicals is discouraged during practical classes. Services of expert lab attendant took overall supervision of repairing, maintenance, annual celebrations of equipments and disposition of lab wastes. It is as per the lab rules for the safe handling of chemicals and disposition of laboratory apparatus. They are frequently monetized by the experts . Besides , the Repairs and Maintenance of Depts. Computers , Computer lab and other intangible equipments of college were done by Green Protocol Measures. Thus avoiding toxic substances to harm the environment. Green Campus Initiatives and Green Belt foster an eco-friendly atmosphere to the campus.

As per the Best Practices 2019-20, 'Malarvadi' a program initiated to preserve the ' natural beauty' of the college. With this scheme of disposal of Waste and Management , ' Clean Campus Program' is initated. Thus making the college premises neat and tidy. Thus inducing a ' commitment' in students towards NATURE. Actions were undertaken for societal awareness programme by Department of Chemistry , NSS and NCC. A safe disposal of sanitizer prepared by the Department of Chemistry was undertaken with the outbreak of the pandemic COVID -19 and were distributed to the public. Thus public ' intervention, is aimed at ! Besides masks distribution by the NSS and surgical disposition of masks were scientifically done by the Department of Chemistry.

A detailed 'plan of action ' is chalked by the Department of Chemistry for making a Green Campus every year (World Environment Day) Thus protection of soil, climate, natural sources , flood relief operations , Suchitva Mission Campaign and Participation of PO in SMC was conducted. By avoiding all types of plastic and food wastes a new concept " Green Belt "was introduced. It is an hallmark to waste management and campus cleaning drive, thanks to the NSS units of the College . Thus a team of Fifteen volunteers were formed for this and giving instructions and guidelines for volunteers through their regular visits for bringing a " Green Campus".

7.2 - Best Practices

7.2.1 - Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual.

1. TITLE OF THE BEST PRACTICE ? ONE DAY ONE RUPEE PROGRAM 2. THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE The program's goal is to help students cope with stress. The students of SN college Chathannur have embarked on an innovative initiative to donate 1Re every day to help their peers who are unable to pay for their education. The money raised is then used to assist and support pupils with learning resources. After their course, the learning materials are collected and stored in a 'book bank,' so that newly admitted students who are financially disadvantaged can use them during their studies. This institution is located in a remote part of Kollam and is a student-friendly campus. The majority of the students come from economically depressed rural areas. These children are subjected to a variety of stressors, including mental, physical, and financial. Their mental and bodily pain is primarily due to financial stress. To address this issue, the college ethics committee resolved to assist financially disadvantaged students. By providing pupils with materials, their learning level can be raised to that of other students. Most significantly, it instils humanitarian feelings in kids,

particularly the ability to share and care for others' suffering, thereby developing into responsible human beings. 3. THE CONTEXT The programme began in 2016 as part of the establishment of the college Ethics Committee, with the goal of assisting students who could not afford to purchase textbooks. To eliminate disparities between students, the ethics committee was able to determine that the immediate cause was the students' lack of financial means, which hampered their academic advancement. 4. THE PRACTICE The first stage in this attempt is to identify the students in each department who are financially disadvantaged. As part of this, each class's tutors, in collaboration with the ethics committee coordinator, class leaders, and the principal, choose one student who is in desperate need of financial support. As a result, students from each class gather one rupee per day to earn funds for the chosen student. This money is utilised not just for academic materials, but also to assist their family in times of financial difficulty. Naturally, some students may be hesitant to seek assistance; nevertheless, anonymity is always maintained to avoid such situations .Since Our higher education aims at a holistic and multidisciplinary educational system this initiative of our college helps in providing students with an opportunity to develop intellectual, social, physical, emotional and moral in an integrated manner. 5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS Through this program our college has made a big difference in the lives of people with a rupee. The amount collected Is being given to orphanages as well as to the students too. It has been a success with the entire involvement of the college with the dedication of the students. A book is also maintained by the college on the details of the student's as well as the amount collected on behalf of this program. 6. PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED

There has been support issues from some students in promoting this program and as the financial resources aren't always sufficient it may be difficult to provide further assistance to students. Not all students participate in this venture, sometimes their absence might also cause problems in collecting the money.

1. TITLE OF THE BEST PRACTICE ? ANNAM BRAHMAM/ POTHICHORU 2. THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE a) Annam brahmam- our college aims at a hunger free campus, thus the twin initiatives "Annam Brahmam" and "Pothichoru" has been implemented to instill love for the fellow beings. Annam brahmam (Food is God) aims at satiating the belly of the college mates and "Pothichoru"(Food Parcel) is for the inmates in the orphanage. The objectives of Annam Braham are as follows, ? Encouraging the students from underprivileged classes and

economically backward class students to pursue higher education. ? To provide nutritious meal to the students ? To increase interest among the students regarding their studies ? To increase their health status ? Increasing the harmony between the students ? To increase the enrollment of students. 3. THE CONTEXT Given our college is located in a rural area, the majority of our students come from poor families. Certain groups of students were less likely to attend classes, and these students underperformed. The cause was discovered during the counselling session to be the family's financial limits. As a result, they are experiencing food shortages and other challenges. There should be nothing in their way of completing their education, so this problem should be remedied, as food is one of the most basic need for human survival on our planet. As a result, they collect homely food from their classmates, which is collected and stored by the departments. This strategy was developed for the benefit of such pupils in order to address this issue. 4. THE PRACTICE First the class tutor, class representative, Ethics committee coordinator asks those students who are in need to report their names. Then the food is collected for them which is kept inside their respective departments. Students might collect it from there during the lunch hour. 5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS ? Attendance of the students has increased ? Drop out rate has become minimal ? Some of them completed their degree. 6. PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED The biggest challenge of the scheme is the identification of the deserving candidates. Some students do not come forward to receive the parcel fearing embarrassment.

b) TITLE OF THE BEST PRACTICE: POTHICHORU 2. THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE ? part of social service ? learning through social work ? to inculcate fellow feeling and respect towards elders ? value of charity ? food for the needy ? bring forth the spirit of responsibility ? to provide equal and sufficient opportunities to students to interact with the inmates.

3. THE CONTEXT The students' young minds should be filled with empathy. The institution is very much concerned about involving students to ensure the charity activities and thus involving the students to meet outreach activities. The happiness in giving and sharing with others is being enjoyed by the students through their active participation in the outreach activities in the society. 4. THE PRACTICE This initiative was started in the year 2016 and so far, we have distributed 1000 food parcels. The food is collected from our college students and taken to different orphanages and old age homes monthly. Regularly visiting might bring forth a great change in the students individually. This initiative is to

imbibe the culture in the minds of youth and make them good citizens of tomorrow. A sense of satisfaction is aroused in the minds of our students. They feel that they have specific roles in the society apart from studying. The resources generated for donations are being mobilized from the students and the institution. 5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS The initiative's effectiveness is that it instils in students a sense of responsibility and worry, causing them to recognise that their family members should never be in such a predicament. True accountability will be combined with moral obligation and the development of a strong mindset among young minds. As a result, it is considered one of the best techniques for cultivating the best spirit in pupils. 7. PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED ? The students were from heterogenous groups with various social, economic and cultural backgrounds. ? The process of synchronizing with the true spirit shall not enter into the young mind instantaneously. ? Continuous nurturing the idea in their mindsets is imminent ? Pandemic and flood situation posed a challenge during the years 2019 -2021. 1. TITLE OF THE BEST PRACTICE ? AGROPARK - ORGANIC FARMING 2. THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE ? Create awareness among students to protect nature and environment. ? Clean and healthy campus

? Promoting farming tradition and support agroforestry farming projects. ? Turning the unused land in the college productive. ? A venture for the post-covid food scarcity 3. THE CONTEXT Kerala has a long history of agriculture, rice fields, vegetable farming, and a pleasant climate. However, the climate, farming patterns, and other factors have all changed dramatically in recent years. As Kerala has evolved into a consumer society, we now rely on other states for rice, vegetables, and other necessities. Our culture is also dealing with the rising usage of chemicals and their health repercussions. As a result, it became critical to teach new generation students about our state's rich agricultural history and the benefits of conventional farming. In this regard, we launched the agro park programme in collaboration with our college's Nature Club. Besides this our college is a recognized social entrepreneurship "Swachtha and Rural Engagement Cell". 4. THE PRACTICE The nature club of our college was set up to create among the students the importance and awareness of protecting nature and environment. More than 50 students from various departments were members so this club and club assure their participation in maintain a clean and healthy campus planting more trees, conducting seminars and awareness programs. The institution has successfully framed the action plan and constituted 10 working groups for improving facilities in the campus. As a result,

agropark initiative promotes farming tradition and support agroforestry farming projects. As part of these 15 acres of unused land in the college turned productive and is now with pregnant with pulses. keeping in mind the post covid food scarcity, Nature Club is associated with the "Subhiksha Kerala" project of Kerala government, Agricultural Department, NSS and Staff Association of our college has started a farming venture of cultivating black gram ,Ldies Finger, tapioca in 15 acres of barren land. The inauguration was held on august 17 by famous actor come MLA Mukesh. It has also organized tree planation programs and awareness campaigns on all important days related to nature. 5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS Quantity of agricultural products from the cultivation is the evidence of success of the program. Black gram, chilly, tapioca around 150 kg vegetables were harvested. There was an increase in demand for our products in the local market as it is organic. The program brought a thorough shift in the attitude of the students and they became more environmentally conscious. They also brought seeds and plant shoots to the college. 6. PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED ? Converting the barren land to farming and its initial expense were the biggest challenges. ? The semester system and busy academic schedule made it difficult to find extra time for the students

? Terrain round the college is not much fertile so it took more effort to convert it into agricultural land ? Another problem is the scarcity of water for irrigating the crops. ? As it was during the lockdown period availability of students were difficult. 1. TITLE OF THE BEST PRACTICE ? SHE - CARE 2. THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE ? Promote safe Hygiene practice ? Relief to girls during menstrual emergencies ? Privacy space and independence to access the napkins ? Promote sustainable life style ? Improve the selfconfidence ? To engage and empower students to choose healthy practices, and make changes in their lives. ? To ease and maintain the balanced stress levels. ? To raise awareness of importance of health issues among individuals. ? To reduce absenteeism from classes during menstruation which leads to poor performance 3. THE CONTEXT Girls face prejudiced attitudes on menstruation, due to social and cultural restrictions they experience embarrassment and stress during periods. Also In general, girls lack awareness or have inadequate information about menstruation. There are more than 50% female students in our college. Majority of them are from rural background and hails from economically weaker section. Many a time due to financial constraints girls are deprived of access to sanitary napkins. This was resulting in skipping classes. Nonaccessibility of proper menstrual protection products and nonhygienic practices leads to physical and mental stress. Therefore,

it was felt that menstruation, should not come in the way of our girl students' performance. Adolescent girl students have lack of awareness about healthy lifestyle. Menstrual hygiene and management are an issue that is insufficiently acknowledged and has not received adequate attention in either education or the water and sanitation sector. Adolescence is a transitional phase from childhood to adulthood. Among adolescents, girls are especially vulnerable and more susceptible biologically to reproductive tract infections. In rural India, health education given to these girls builds knowledge, motivates them to improve and maintain their health, prevent disease and reduce risky behaviours. Adolescents need to have access to health education, including education on sexuality, quality health services, including sexual and reproductive; and a supportive environment both at home and in communities and colleges. 4. THE PRACTICE A Female teacher is volunteered to maintain the distribution of sanitary pads in each department. It was decided not to collect any money from the students in which a register is also maintained . Also, The college in line with "Swatch Bharat" 5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:

This helped to understand that menstruation is a normal biological process, the facts related to the menstrual cycle and managing it with dignity, without discomfort. They are following healthy way to manage periods. Some of the feelings expressed by the girl students: i. They feel safe in case of unexpected menstruation. ii. Help them to manage periods, they need not carry the pads in their bags. iii. Help them to overcome the menstruation pressure, iv. Helped to maintain healthy menstruation and concentrate on studies. v. Reduced the risk of urinary tract infections because of using damp menstrual clothes, using the sanitary pads for longer time vi. There is no complaint of any type of harassment registered by either girl students or female staff. vii. Due to continuous encouragement and positive atmosphere, the girl students remained ahead of boys in many exams and recognized as toppers/rank holders. viii. The proportion of girl students' participation in various events, programmes has been considerably increased. 6. PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED ? There is little hesitation to collect sanitary pads at the beginning of this venture and scarcity of funds has limited budget towards this planned work. Still there are miss conceptions about Menstrual Hygiene and Management is inadequate and there is a need to demystify myths.
