

The questionnaire were circulated among students of the college and the responses were compiled and analysed thoroughly. Based on the feedback collected, viable suggestions and necessary actions were taken.

Analysis:

The response of more than 40% of the students agree that the curriculum is optimally designed and about 20% of the students strongly agree regarding the effectiveness of the curriculum. Few of them perceived for an improvisation of the curriculum.

Preamble:

The feedback from the students is taken by the IQAC for every academic session. The factors include opinion regarding aims and objectives of the syllabi, the depth and adequateness of the course content for significant learning outcomes, availability of sufficient prescribed books, reference material and related books, appropriateness of pre-requisite courses, balance between theory and Laboratorywork, etc.

Process: The students are supplied with a pre-designed five -point scale style questionnaire to record their opinion. The recorded choices are then processed to obtain the feedback Analysis Report. The five -point scale consisting of choices Strongly disagree, Disagree, uncertain, Agree and Strongly agree is incorporated for the feedback and analysis.

ACTION TAKEN REPORT:

Proper suggestions were consolidated to communicate to the Principal and the College Council to ensure the proper redressal of the suggestions. College has renovated the computer lab and purchased more computers based on the feedback received from students. College council has suggested to increase the number of student internships and placements. Considering the request communicated to the university, a new PG Chemistry course was sanctioned to college and procedures to start some more UG courses are underway. Management has initiated the construction of new building for augmenting the infrastructure of the college so as to facilitate students with a better academic environment. The university acted upon our request for the Mathematics syllabus and invited our mathematics faculties to the academic council where we voiced our concerns and expecting appropriate actions from the university.
