

. CERTIFICATE COURSE IN FOOD CHEMISTRY (2019-2020)

Department of Chemistry enrolled its third batch students for the certificate course in Food chemistry during the academic year 2019-2020. A total of 26 students registered for the course and classes were arranged in Chemistry department. The theory

sessions and lab sessions were handled by the faculties of the department. The basics of food chemistry, pigments and flavours of food, food additives, adulteration, food packing and packaging materials, and methods of food preservation were the topics included for the course. Lab sessions were conducted at laboratory of department of chemistry and students were given hands-on practice for analysing the food quality. The course felicitated the students to gain basic knowledge in food chemistry and equipped them with the skills needed to pursue a career in this field. The students completed the course with good grades and course completion certificates were awarded to students.



DIPLOMA COURSE IN FOOD CHEMISTRY

AIM OF THE COURSE:

The aim of this course is to provide students a better understanding of food chemistry and make students competent enough to work in food related industries. This course involves the study of nature and chemical composition of food, chemistry of carbohydrates, lipids and vitamins. This also provides the students the analytical skills to assess the quality of food samples.

OBJECTIVES:

- To get familiarise with chemical nature and composition of food
- To gain knowledge on food adulterants and its identification.
- To know the chemistry of food packing materials
- To understand the methods of food preservation and its chemistry

 To equip the students with basic skills which are essential to get hired in food-based industries and food analytical labs.

SYLLABUS:

Module 1: Introduction to food Chemistry

Food Chemistry: Food additives, colouring and flavouring agents, preservatives, anti-oxidants, commonly used permitted and non-permitted food colours artificial sweeteners-taste enhancers, Health effects of fast foods, instant foods, dehydrated foods and junk foods, trans fat.

Module 2: Pigments, flavours and colours in food

Food Pigments & Flavouring Agents: Importance, types and sources of pigments - their changes during processing and storages, colours added to foods, vegetable, fruit and spice flavours, flavours of milk and meat products, effect of processing on flavour Components.

Module 3: Food Additives & Preservation

Basic concepts of additives in food, general principles for the application. Examples & role play in food processing – Preservatives, Antioxidants, Emulsifiers, Stabilizers (Thickeners), Sequestering and buffering agents, Bleaching and maturing agents, Nutrient supplements, Non-nutritive and special dietary sweeteners, Anti-caking agents, Foaming and anti-foaming agents, Leavening agents, Firming agents, Humectants and texturisers, Clarifying agents. Food preservation and methods of preservation

Module 4: Food packaging and Packaging materials

Introduction to Food packaging and Packaging materials, Food packages – bags, pouches, wrappers, tetra packs-applications. Characteristics and functions of packaging materials for different foods, Modern packaging materials and forms-Glass containers, metal cans, composite containers, aerosol containers, rigid plastic packages, semi rigid packaging, flexible packaging.

Module 5: Carbohydrates, Lipids and Vitamins

Carbohydrates - functions, source, utilization, dietary fibre and health. Lipids, Fat soluble vitamins -A, D, E and K- functions, source, requirements, deficiency disorders. Water soluble vitamins -The B-complex vitamins -Thiamine, Riboflavin, Niacin, Folic acid, Biotin, Pantothenic acid, B12 and Vitamin C - functions, source, requirements and deficiency disorders.

- Chemical Analysis of Vitamin C
 Determination of pH in foods


STUDENTS ACHIEVEMENTS:

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5.SEMINAR /CONFERENCE /WORKSHOPS ATTENDED AND ORGANSIED PROGRAMS:



Programme-3: Two-day Workshop on "Foundations on Functional Analysis"




Programme – 9: A Webinar on "How to Start a Research Work"

6. INFRASTRUCTRE AND LEARNING RESOURCES:

All the necessary and supportive lab equipment are purchased by the purchasing committee based on the decisions taken by the college council on the requirement list given by the department heads. Services of expert lab attendants are provided in all labs. Repairing, maintenance and annual calibrations of equipments are also done periodically by the external agencies. Lab rules are displayed in the laboratories for safe handling of chemicals and laboratory apparatus. Frequent maintenance of laboratories is done and is monitored by concerned department HODs. The well-stocked College Library has a property counter, librarian's room, circulation (Issue/Return) counter, Online Public Access Catalogue, Processing etc and well portioned with a Text-Book Section, Periodical Section and with reading room facility. An e-library facility having a 1000 Mbps internet bandwidth to access e-journals through INFLIBNET and N-LIST, Reference Section, Book Bank. College library is using PD account for purchasing books and journals. Yearly auditing is conducted and shortages of books are being noted and the list of required books is forwarded by the concerned department HoDs to the principal, the request then forwarded to library committee for final approval Our college have a well-maintained campus which spreads over 28 acres of serene green land. The students actively participate in sports and cultural activities simultaneously and are awarded and rewarded. The well-equipped Sports room enabled students to play in door games like chess, caroms etc., and a seminar hall meditation and yoga and enough practical outdoor sessions such as shuttle badminton, volley ball etc. We have two play grounds with adequate facilities.
