## Best practices successfully implemented by the Institution

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## **I. Best Practice : AGROPARK**

- The main objectives of this initiative are:
  - To preserve the ecology of the campus through environment-friendly practices.
  - To promote organic farming practices and agroforestry within the campus.
  - To turn the barren unused land of the college into productive land.
  - To raise awareness about the significance of farming in mitigating the global food crisis.
  - To offer the students hands-on training on various agriculture options such as crop farming, pisciculture, bee farming, etc.

The initiative has provided the students with an opportunity to learn more about the environment they live in. They are also gifted with practical knowledge of how to care for and nurture the vegetation and other life forms. **THE CONTEXT:** The initiative of AGROPARK was set up initially to utilise the vast amount of land that was available in the institution. The diligence of the NSS, NCC, Nature Club, Bhoomitrasena and the other clubs successfully transformed the land into cultivable areas. Thus the area around campus was divided and transformed into mini-projects like the Pocket Gardens, Weedless farming, Miyawaki Forest, and Blue Serene. Other initiatives like Elixir and a cow were also adopted later. In the post-covid scenario, the college ramped up the AGROPARK initiative to provide a helping hand for the people who were struggling to overcome the ravages of the pandemic. The state of Kerala has always been well-known for its agrarian society, pleasant climate and cleanliness. However, in the past few years due to global changes in climate and varied lifestyles of people, the pattern of food & agriculture has completely changed along with increased rates of diseases and deteriorated living conditions. The post-Covid food scarcity added to this issue. The NSS, NCC, Nature club and Bhoomitrasena along with the support of all the departments and the Local government thus organized diverse programmes such as

Vanamaholsavam, Thanalorukkam Vilavedukkam, Green Energy, etc. These activities also fall under the AGROPARK initiative.

**THE PRACTICE:** Under the AGROPARK initiative, the college grounds have been efficiently utilised for the cultivation of many crops. Upland paddy is the major crop cultivated along with corn and small-scale horticulture. The college also practices weedless farming which provides some of the best organic products. Apart from land cultivation, one of the most popular initiatives under AGROPARK is Blue Serene. ‘Blue Serene’ is the pisciculture initiative of the college, that was set up with the aim of providing students hands-on training on how to breed fish in commercially viable ways. ‘Elixir’ was likewise initiated to familiarise students with the possibilities of bee-keeping and the profitable nature of the endeavour. The college has also hosted many programmes under the initiative. One of these was an initiative to set up a mini forest under the “Vanamaholsavam” programme where the NSS unit, Nature club and ‘BhoomithraSena’ in association with the Kerala State Forest Department planted tree saplings within the span of the college. This programme was inaugurated by Honourable Minister (Forest & Wildlife), Sri. A K Saseendran. The NSS unit and Nature Club in association with the “Thanalorukkam Vilavedukkam” Programme of City Police planted fifty cashew saplings on the campus. Another activity conducted by the Nature club is the cultivation of Black Gram and Tapioca in association with the Subhiksha Keralam Project of the Kerala Government, the Agriculture Department, NSS and the Staff Association of our college. The inauguration of the program was held on August 17 by the famous actor cum MLA Mukesh. MLA Jayalal also presided over the function. Apart from these, a plastic-free campus, proper solid waste management practices, energy saving measures such as the use of LED bulbs, installation of solar panels etc are followed in the college.

**EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:** Owing to the hardwork and diligence of the students and the various clubs engaged in the AGROPARK initiative, the initiative has slowly grown to envelop new projects and innovative cultivation practices. All the projects that fall under the initiative are cared for and nurtured by the students and staff. The good quality crops which were harvested from the land and the healthy fish and honeybees prove that the diligence of our students has paid off. Some of these final products are even sold in the nearby cooperative society markets. The resounding success of the AGROPARK initiative is thus evident. The programme also brought a transformation in the attitude of the students as they became more environmentally conscious, with some even turning to farming practices as a source of income.

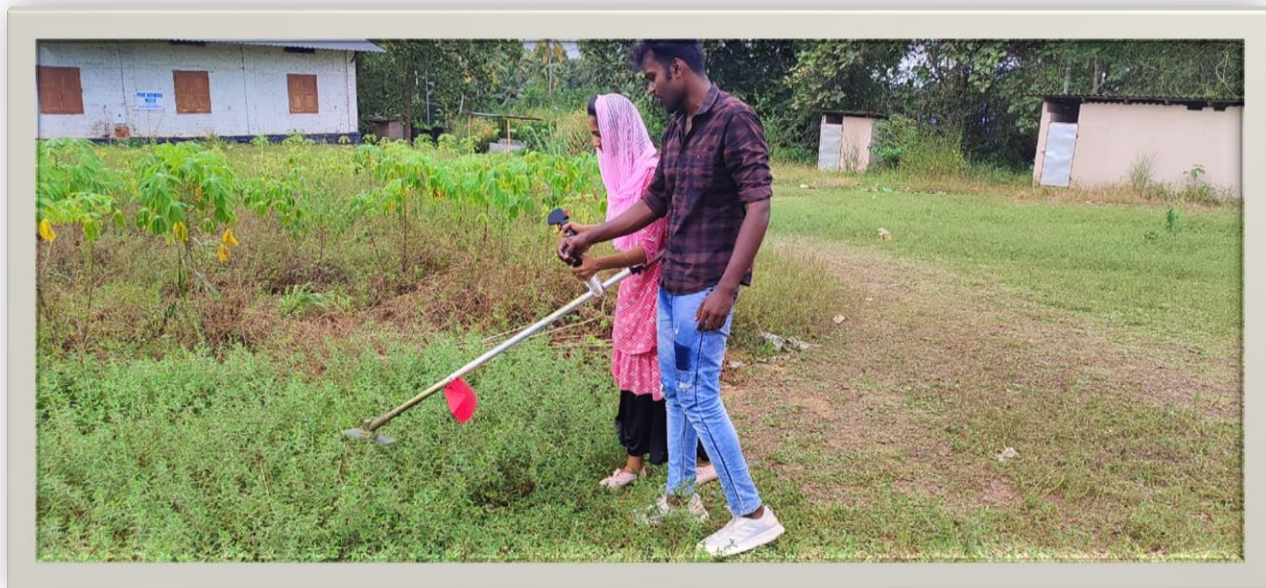
**PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED:** With every innovative idea comes its own set of challenges. In the case of the AGROPARK initiative, the most daunting challenge was the expense to convert the barren land of the institution into arable land. With meticulous planning and teamwork, this was eventually overcome. The next big challenge was the busy academic schedule of the students and teachers. It was a challenge to find time amidst the busy university schedule to tend to the projects that came under AGROPARK. Farming practices require consistent care and constant attention. A lapse in this regard could lead to the initial efforts being wasted. However the students and teachers came together to find time for these activities and succeeded in balancing out their academic commitments with their extracurricular activities.

## 1. Pocket Gardens

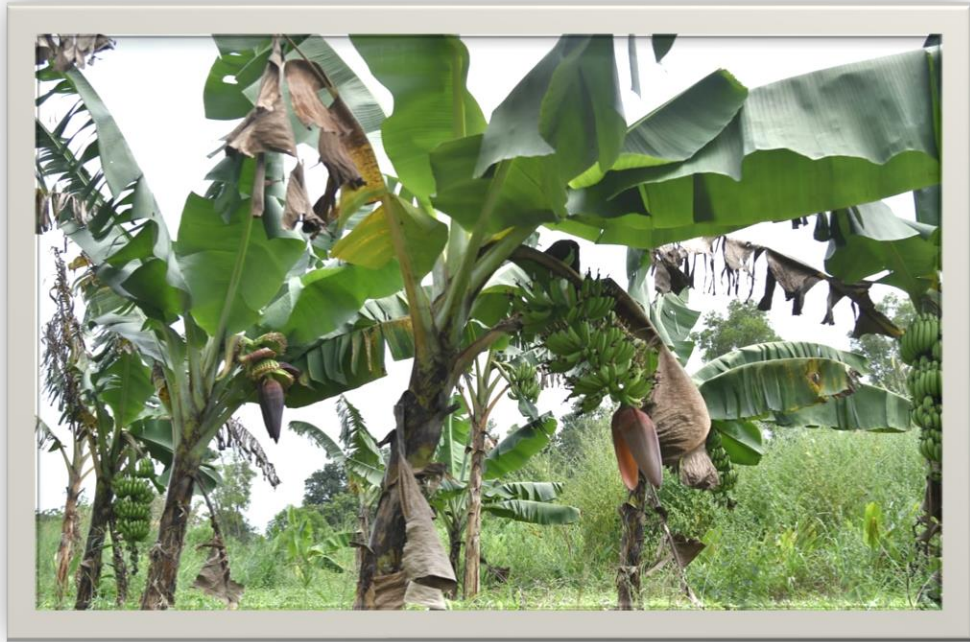

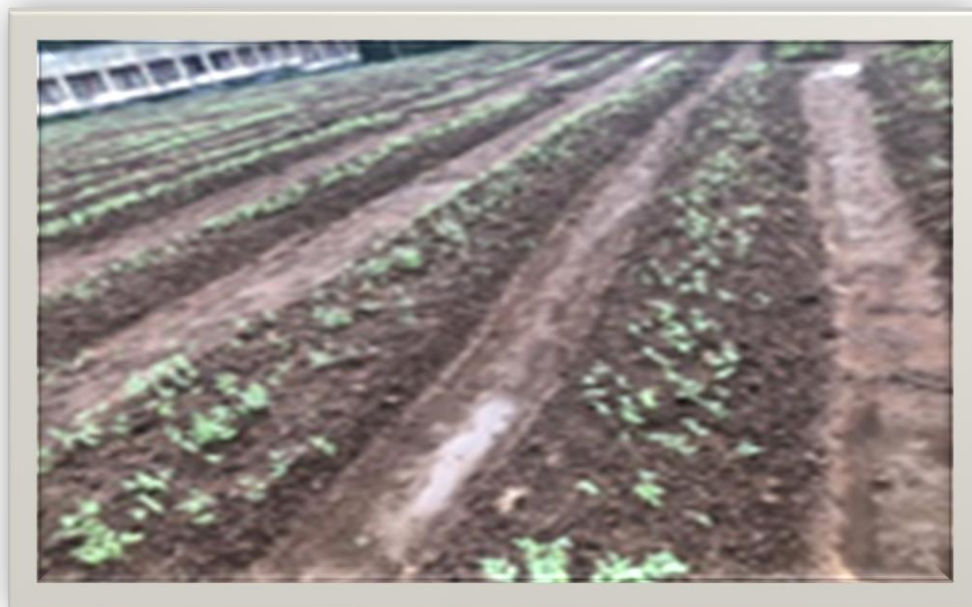

## 2. Elixir

'Elixir' is the bee-keeping project that falls under the AGROPARK initiative. Bee-keeping or bee farming is the practice of managing honey bees in man-made hives for their products. Bee farming requires a certain amount of training, but once the training has been given, it is a highly profitable trade. It can be a source of income or a hobby. The bee farm in campus has attracted many curious students to learn about it. The students are given hands-on training and they are made aware of the endless opportunity of this trade.

### 3. Miyawaki Forest

The Miyawaki method of growing dense forests on small areas of land was developed by the Japanese botanist and ecologist Akira Miyawaki. This method enabled us to produce a naturally biodiverse forest in the campus using limited space. In any urban area there is a shortage of space that makes it hard to plant trees or desirable plants. But the Miyawaki method of planting creates a dense forest in a limited space that can have positive effects on the ecosystem of the place. The campus' very own Miyawaki forest is a prime example of this.

#### **4. Blue Serene**

The 'Blue Serene' is the pisciculture project that falls under the AGROPARK initiative. The objective of the project was to commercially breed fish in an artificial pond. The students are given hands-on training on how to feed the fish and ensure their health. The commercial viability of the project has even encouraged some students to consider it as a future source of income.

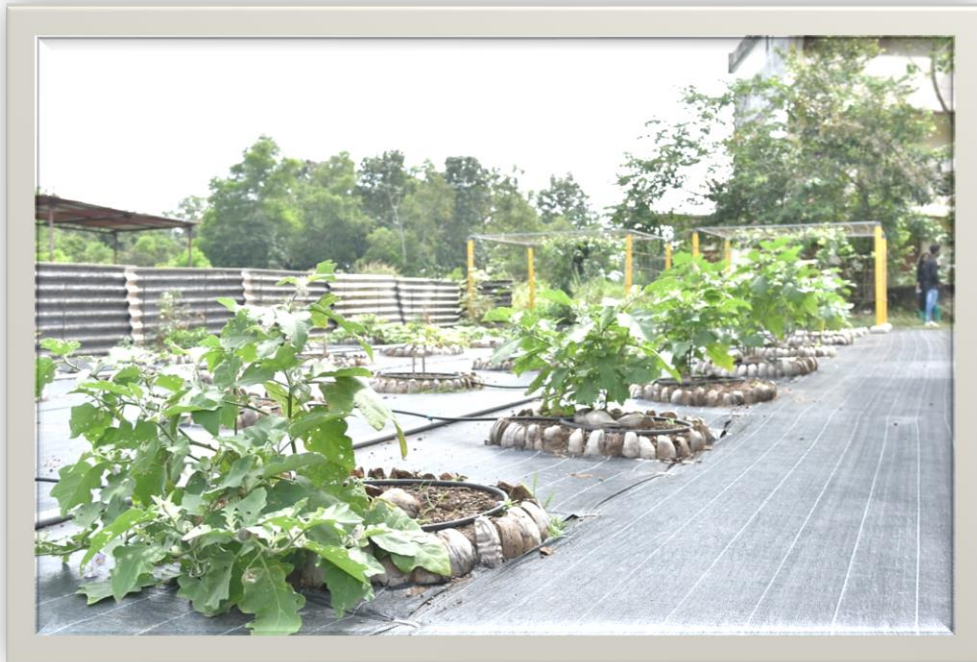


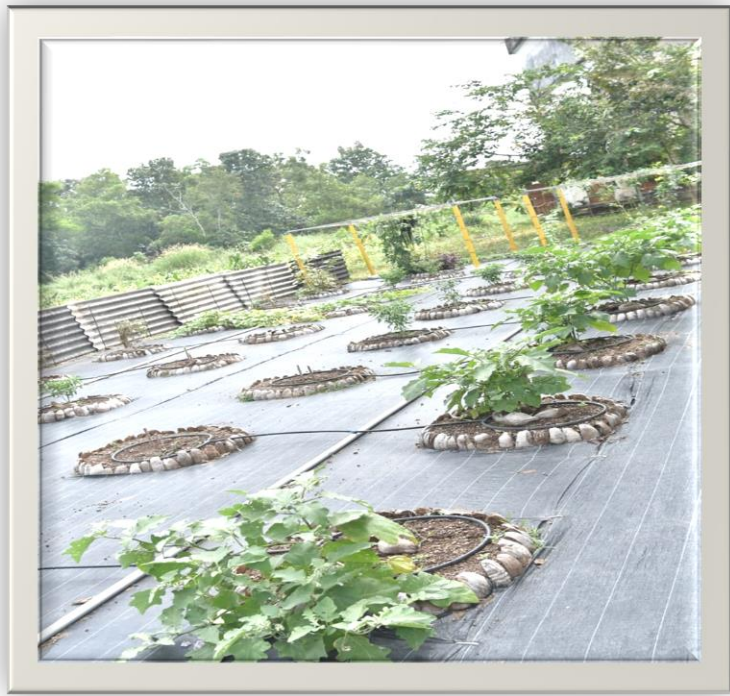

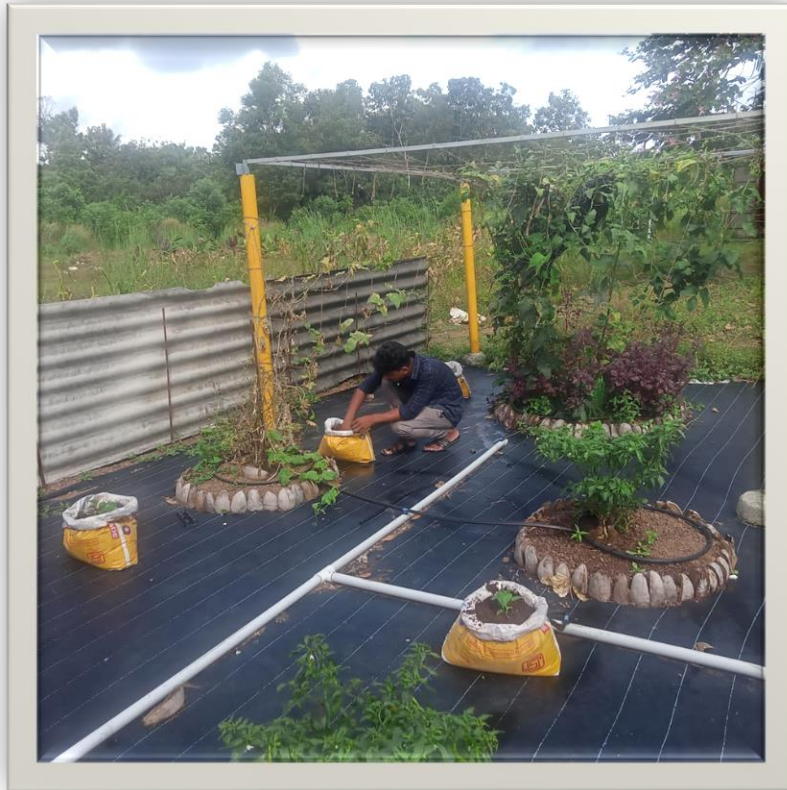
## 5. Weedless Farming

The weedless farming project was initiated to introduce the students to a chemical free farming technique. As the occurrence or growth of weeds are controlled in this type of farming, there is no need to use chemicals to prevent weeds from growing. The absence of weeds means that the crops do not have to compete for nourishment and thus thrive with this technique. The healthy, organic produce from this farm are tended to by the students and harvested at the right time to distribute to students, staff or the people who live near the campus.

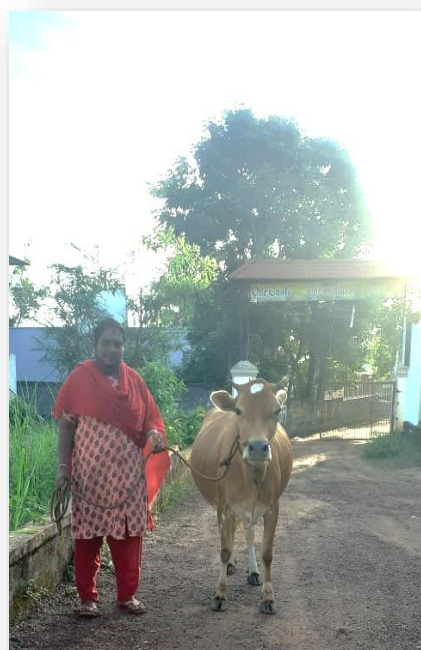

In addition to these initiatives, the college also owns a cow. The cow is tended to and fed regularly. It is also a source for the dairy product requirement of the girls hostel on the campus.



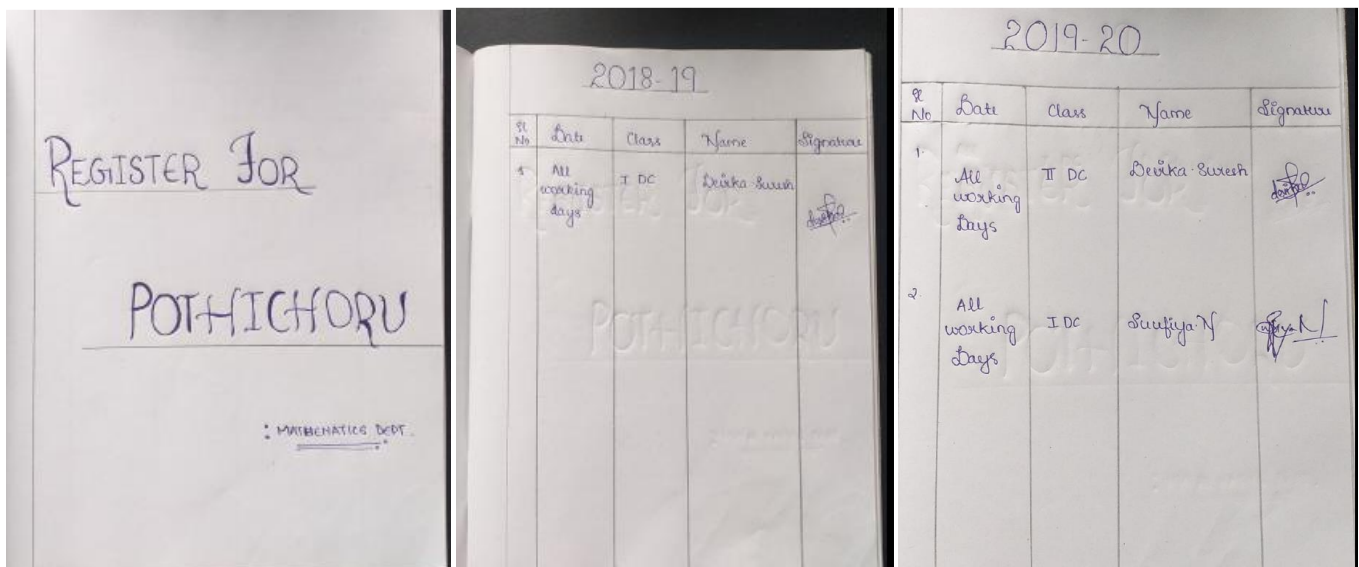

## II. WE-CARE - EMBRACING HUMANITY

The college came up with the initiative of We-Care to inculcate humanitarian principles like sharing and caring. The many programmes that fall under the We-Care initiative encourage the students to have compassion for the less fortunate among us and instill a love for fellow beings. The following are some of the programmes conducted under this initiative.

### 1. Pothi Choru

‘Pothi Choru’ (Food Packet) is an initiative that was aimed at helping the students who are socio-economically backward. The primary reason for poor performance among these students was their preoccupation with their financial and subsequent emotional struggles. As a result of their financial backwardness, the families of these students were seen to experience food shortages and other challenges. We-Care intervened and organised a programme whereby the socio-economically well-off students bring homely food for their classmates who are in need.

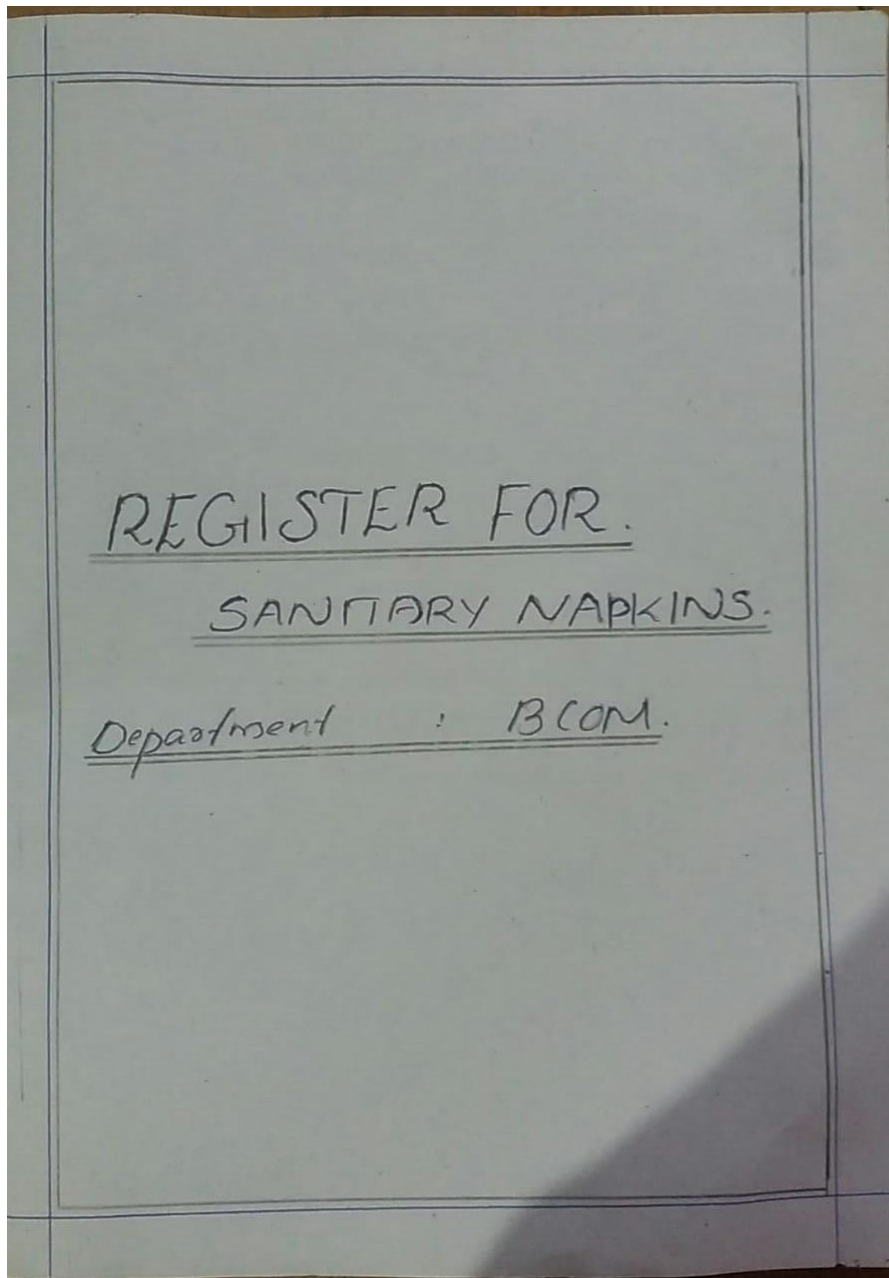


Sample of registration for “Pothichoru”

#### 4. Production of Hand Sanitizer

During the period of the initial covid outbreak, an upsurge of positive cases with its bustling impact started reporting from March 2020 onwards. For reducing the transmission risk, continual alerts were given by the medical experts to ensure social distancing, and the health department mandated the use of sanitisers and masks. The rapid spread of the pandemic and the resultant increase in demand for medical requisites resulted in the scarcity of medical essentials like sanitisers and masks. At this phase our government started ramping up sanitiser production. Keeping this in mind and as an extension activity, the Department of Chemistry, Sree Narayana College Chathannur has volunteered the mission of preparing hand sanitisers in our chemistry lab and prepared 5 Liters of sanitiser on 18/03/2020. The hand sanitiser was prepared by using the ingredients such as Isopropyl alcohol, aloe vera gel, hydrogen peroxide, glycerol, and a few drops of lavender oil. Faculties and students of the department conjointly acted for this mission and distributed the prepared hand sanitisers in 100 mL spray bottles to Chathannur KSRTC Bus station, auto stand and to a nearby locale, 30 such bottles were doled out in phases outside the college and about 2 Liters were used up in college itself.

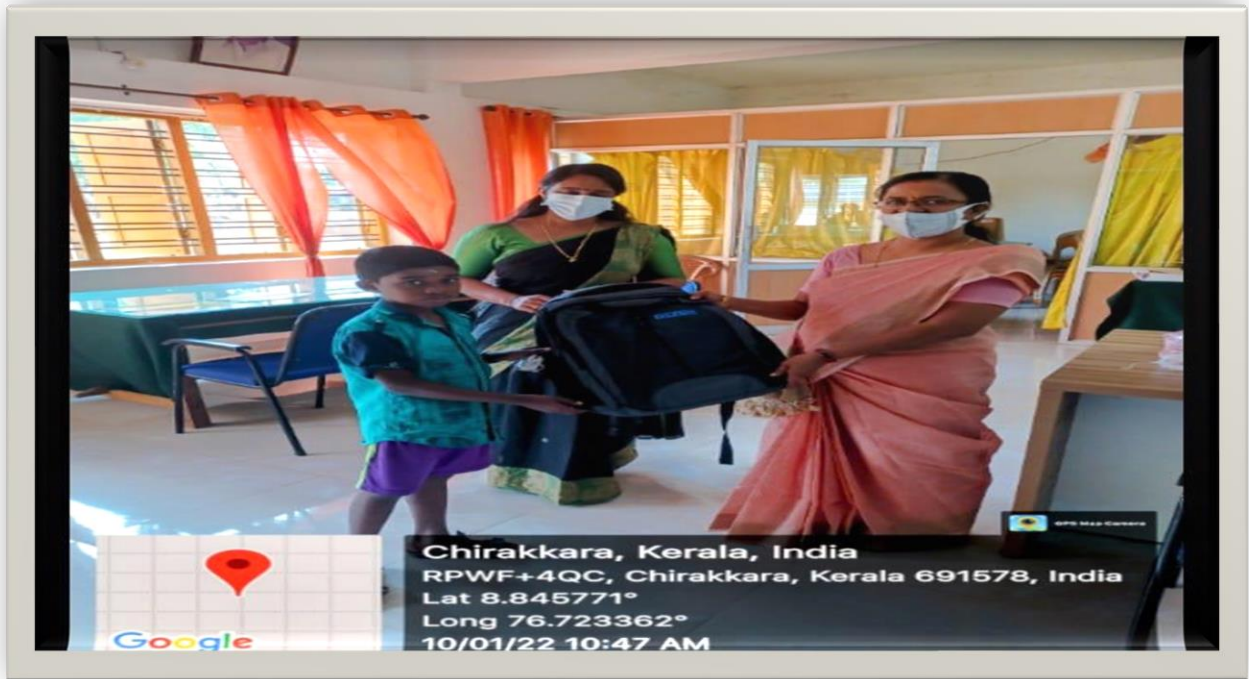

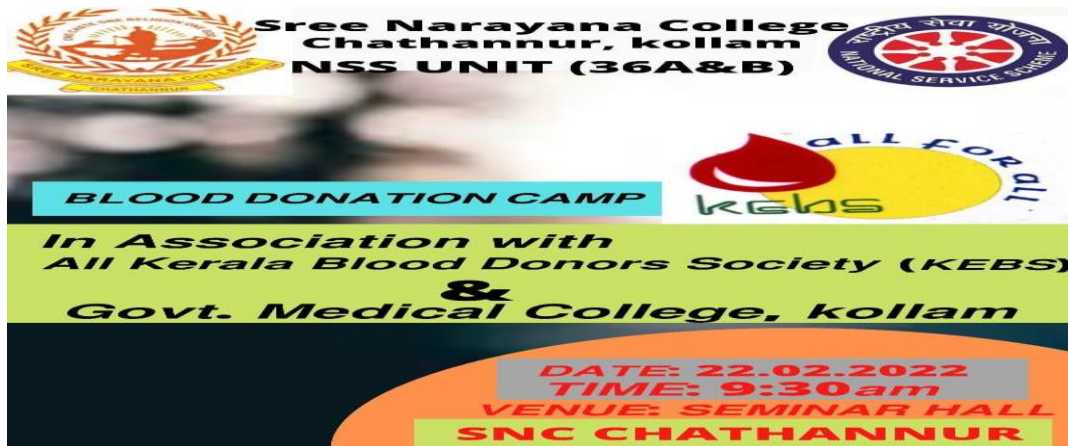
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## 7. Blood Donation Camp

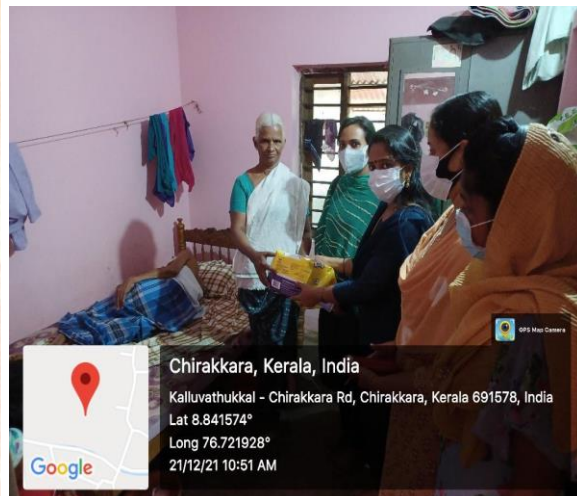
